

COWELL TAKES TITLE IN A. A. U. WRESTLING

Throws Jenson in Metropolitan Final—N.Y.A.C. Team Wins

Lawrence Cowell, who last week captured the national title, last night carried off the 145-pound Metropolitan A. A. U. wrestling championship at the New York Athletic Club. The West Side Y. M. C. A. mainstay went through the qualifying rounds without a defeat, and pinned Nick Kunlund of the New York A. C. to gain the final with John Jenson of the New York Institute for the Blind.

In the final, Jenson held the titleholder on even terms for the first two minutes, then slowed down, Cowell scoring with a high half nelson and body scissors at 7:04.

The New York A. C. annexed the team crown with 34 points, displacing the West Side Y. M. C. A. The Winged Footers took four of the eight individual titles. West Side was a distant second with 24 markers.

Sgt. Humphrey Michaels of the Army, who had been in the Walter Reed Hospital in Washington for seventeen months after having been injured overseas, won a hotly contested 4-3 decision from Charles McKinney of the home club in the heavyweight class.
